REF: Statement of case for Road abandonment order
To whom it may concern,

I am local farmer who has lived in this area, and farmed land here for almost 60 years. My home is located directly below the proposed processing plant. I strongly object to the proposed applications made by Dalradian gold. This has been a matter of great distress for me and family since Dalraidan have come into our community. I have sent in numerous objection letters already which can be viewed.

The Mullydoo Road

Abandonment of the Mullydoo Road: this is a Council maintained road which I use numerous times a week, to go work, leisure i.e. walking, cycling, moving farm animals when necessary and to attend the local community centre (Greencastle GAA). The abandonment of this road will cause a lot of hardship for me personally, as I will lose access to my legally held turbary rights which I use the Mullydoo road to access. The abandonment of this road will leave me with no access to my turbary rights and our local mass rock on the Crockanboy hill.

The Green Road

Granting planning permission would result in the total destruction of the historic Green Road, a Public Right of Way as asserted by Fermanagh and Omagh District Council. The road itself has a long history, and to allow it to be destroyed would be a devastating blow to the local community and the history of the island of Ireland. Likewise, the recent court case in relation to this road was similarly devastating when I heard local people, whom I have known all my life perjuring themselves in court for Dalradian's benefit. This is one of the many examples of how Dalradian has divided our once close-knit community.
