A Private Street is defined as any street that is not currently part of the public road and as such is not inspected and maintained by the Department for Infrastructure (the Department). These are typically located in new developments. Before they can become part of the public road network, they must be adopted by the Department.  A key area of this work relates to the completion of site inspections to ensure that construction standards are met prior to adoption of private developments into the public road network. The developer pays the costs of this at the start of the development process and it is this fee that the department is proposing to increase.  People buying a house in a rural or urban new build development will likely be apportioned part of this Private Streets fee by the developer.
