

PUBLIC APPOINTMENT VACANCIES – APPOINTMENT OF 5 NON-EXECUTIVE MEMBERS TO THE BOARD OF NORTHERN IRELAND TRANSPORT HOLDING COMPANY

DRD will soon be advertising an open competition to recruit 5 Members for the Board of Northern Ireland Transport Holding Company (NITHC). Advertisements will be placed in the three main papers – the Irish News, The Newsletter and the Belfast Telegraph in week commencing 6 July.

The process involves an application form and interview process. Applications are welcome from all sections of society.

The remuneration is approximately £12,205 per annum based on an anticipated attendance of up to five business days per month. A Non-Executive Member who acts as Chair of any of the Board's three Sub Committees receives additional remuneration of £2,395 per annum. The Board Members will be expected to attend monthly Board meetings and other adhoc meetings as required. This may involve a commitment both inside and outside of normal working hours, including representing NITHC at occasional evening engagements.

The Minister for Regional Development wants to improve diversity on boards and wishes to attract a wide range of applicants for the public appointments which he makes.

Women, younger people, people with disabilities and people from ethnic minority communities are currently under-represented and applications from members of these groups would be particularly welcome.

The Department is operating the Guaranteed Interview Scheme in this competition for applicants with a disability.
