



### UPPER DROMORE ROAD WARRENPOINT.

Thank you for your email dated 21 June 2021 in relation to parking on Upper Dromore Road, Warrenpoint.

The consultation response to Newry Mourne and Down Council Planning, regarding application LA07/2019/0091 was for enablement works to allow access to the industrial development. This included the creation of new access road and right turning facility. The proposal itself did not require any parking. The issue you have highlighted on the Upper Dromore Road is in relation to an existing development and will need to be addressed separately.

Parking on a public footway is not illegal, however if it causes an obstruction to pedestrians, as you have indicated, it may be deemed illegal and then it is a matter for the PSNI to enforce in accordance with Article 88 of the Road Order (NI). We will pass this concern on to the PSNI Traffic Management liaison officer for their attention.





Thank you for your email dated 25 October 2020 requesting, under the Freedom of Information Act, on information in relation to a new entrance on the Upper Dromore Road.

In considering your request on behalf of the Department I have determined that the information requested falls under the aegis of the Environmental Information Regulations 2004, as opposed to the FOI Act 2000.

In response to your request, I can confirm that on the 29 October 2019 planning permission was granted by Newry, Mourne and Down (NM&D) Council Planning (ref LA07/2019/0091/F) for enablement works for an industrial development, creation of new access road and right turning lane.

For information regarding community input, you may wish to contact NM&D Council Planning as this is part of the planning process and as such falls under the Council's remit.

In relation to checks and safety requirements, the application was assessed by Dfl Roads as a statutory consultee to the planning process. A site visit took place and initially amendments were requested to the proposal. These were subsequently addressed by the applicant and once deemed to be to the satisfaction of Dfl Roads no objections, subject to conditions, were offered to NM&D Council Planning.



The works have now been completed in accordance with the planning approval. This includes the reinstatement of a 2m footway along the frontage of the site.

If you are dissatisfied with the handling of your request, you have the right to ask for an internal review. Internal review requests should be submitted within two months of the date of receipt of the response to your original letter and should be addressed to:
