Would it be possible to also request, in a follow up to DFI/2022-0415, the statistics for how many Penalty Charge Notices/fines were paid at £90 and then the subsequent £135 please?

## Response (issued 19 January 2023)

I refer to your email received on 20<sup>th</sup> December 2022 requesting information under the Freedom of Information Act relating to Penalty Charge Notices (PCNs) paid at £90 and at £135 since 1<sup>st</sup> November 2021.

In considering your request on behalf of the Department, I have determined that the information requested falls under the aegis of the Environmental Information Regulations 2004, as opposed to the FOI Act 2000.
