In response to your request, I can confirm that the Department holds some information relating to your request. The number of approved subsistence claims by grade of staff in Dfl Rivers Western Region from 20th May 2021 to 31st December 2022 are provided in the table below.

- Staff Officer and SPTO claims are approved at PPTO grade or above.
